Focus on agroecology practices for sustainable food security in Africa

As the Africa's Food Systems Forum 2023 Summit (AGRF-2023) concluded in Dar Es Salaam, Tanzania, African countries have been urged to focus on agriculture ecology, in response to climate change which is currently threatening food systems. Speaking during the launch of new campaign called 'Fund our future, Action Aid Manager for Tanzania, Mr. Elias Mtinda, noted that the campaign intends to push financial institutions to cut funding for climate harming industrial agriculture and fossil fuel projects. Somalia, an Emerging African Agricultural Success Story to Watch

Long derided as a failed state, Somalia is now emerging as a success in agriculture with its 6.2 million hectares of virgin land for farming and expansive waters for fishing. At the recent Africa Green Revolution Forum (AGRF) in Nairobi, Somali government officials said that about 2.9 million hectares of land — 2.3 million hectares under rain-fed agriculture and 630,000ha under irrigation have been exploited for agriculture. <u>Read</u> More eggs. The project aims to strengthen capacities to innovate for climate resilient agriculture and food system. One of the key activities of the project is the assessment of the Agricultural Innovation System (AIS) in Eritrea. The assessment will also identify major bottlenecks and entry points for strengthening AIS in Eritrea as well as inform policy and decision makers on AIS performance and make recommendations for its improvement. Israel launches 400 ha avocado farm in Kenya to boost production and quality

Granot International Company, one of the biggest producers and packers of avocados has officially launched its operations in Kenya. Granot operates the largest avocado packing house in Israel and produces onethird of Israel's total avocado yield. With an annual revenue of more than USD 1.5billion, it is one of the largest cooperatives in the world. The Israel-based company has begun avocado farming in Kenya and aims to create
