### Mobilizing Agricultural Transformation Potential in our Region

Dear AR4D colleagues,

ASARECA Board OF Directors Vice Chairman, Ambassador Dr. Cheluget and I have since October this year made important visits to Member States to seek audience with our Patrons, the Ministers in charge of Agriculture. In all our visits which have seen us meet the Ministers for Eritrea, Burundi, Kenya, and Rwanda, they key issues of discussion are the same, namely: Finding for sustainable mechanisms financing of ASARECA; strengthening the role of Patron Ministers in the oversight and priority setting of the Association; streamlining coordination of activities of international and multilateral global actors in



agricultural research for development in Member States; etcetera. We will continue these visits, which will culminate into a Ministerial Dialogue early in 2024.

During the past few weeks, we identified with one of our regional blocs, the East African Community, during a two-day strategic engagement workshop on Aflatoxin prevention and control convened in Kampala, Uganda. The workshop provides us an opportunity to re-state our commitment to supporting national and regional initiatives on prevention and control of aflatoxin and its associated losses. Let us work together on this.

For ASARECA, it was such a refresher when we were informed of the visit by a high-powered delegation from the Government of South Sudan to NARO-Uganda to benchmark on innovations that have made NARO one of the top rated research institutions on the Continent. As you may be aware, ASARECA has supported Member States to learn from one another. Any efforts by States to organise such visits in peer countries are encouraged. As a Secretariat, we pledge to continue supporting whenever resources allow.

Lastly, we would like to keep cassava, one of the priority food security and industrial crops in our Continent top on the development agenda. As you may already know, cassava is a vital crop in Africa, with an estimated 60% of the world's cassava production taking place on the continent. The crop provides an essential source of food and income for millions of small-scale farmers, with more than 80% of the cassava produced in Africa being consumed locally. In addition to its role as

a staple food, cassava is also used for industrial purposes, including the production of ethanol, animal feed, and starch.

## Kenya Advances GM Maize to Increase Yields, Reduce use of Pesticides

Kenya has taken a major step toward increasing its food and animal feed production, while reducing pesticide use, by planting genetically modified (GM) insectresistant maize in open fields. With this latest development, Kenyan farmers are now closer to growing GM (Bt) maize on their farms. The Bt maize planted earlier in western Kenya is showing resistance to the destructive stem borer and fall armyworm pests. Bt maize is expected to be commercialized by 2022 if it is approved by Kenya's relevant government agencies. <u>Read More</u>
