Uganda Announces ASARECA Ministerial Conference

The Government of Uganda on May 16 announced that the country was set to host the ASARECA Agriculture Ministerial Conference (AAMC), which will take place at Speke Resort, Munyonyo, Kampala, Uganda, on 17th – 19th May 2023. Addressing the country at Uganda Government Media Centre in the Capital, Kampala, the Minister of State for Agriculture, Animal Industry and Fisheries, Hon. Fred Bwiino Kyakulaga, informed the country that the conference would gather over 350 delegates from 14 member countries. Hon. Kyakulaga informed the country that ASARECA is a beneficial Association at the press briefing in Kampala.

Theme of the conference

The theme of the Conference is: *Building Resilient Food Systems to Feed Africa for Generations.* It is organized by the Government of Uganda through the Ministry of Agriculture, Animal Industry and Fisheries, in conjunction with the Association for Strengthening Agricultural Research in Eastern and Central Africa (ASARECA), and the National Agricultural Research Organization (NARO).

Tanzania rebounds to EU fruits export

In November 2022, European Commission suspended exports of Tanzania's bitter gourd fruit into the EU market, citing the detection of quarantine pests, and demanding the country present the pest surveillance report proving the absence of Thrips palmi Karny. Africa has 60 percent of the world's uncultivated arable land. The agriculture sector accounts for 35 percent of Africa's GDP and employs more Africans than any other sector. So why does Africa spend a in May 2023, after a comprehensive analysis of Tanzania's pest surveillance report, the Plant Health Unit under the European Commission <u>declared Tanzania to be eligible</u> <u>to export bitter gourd</u> fruit to the EU under condition (a) of point 71 of Annex VII of Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/2072.
