This month we joined our Egyptian partners, Heliopolis University, in a workshop to validate Best Management Practices with Egyptian stakeholders, including farmers under the WATDEV Project. The objective of the meeting held in Sekem Farm in Belbeis, was to create awareness to enhance the implementation of selected Best Management Practices and innovations in the local communities of the study areas where Best Management Practices and Innovations will be studied and analyzed for implementation and upscaling. This was one



among many rounds of awareness sessions in Egypt, Ethiopia, Sudan and Kenya where multiactor stakeholders selected a combination of BMPs for each intervention country to pilot under the Project. This project is a special intervention in the face of climate change, which is meant to change the narrative of challenges into opportunities. In this particular case, the project promotes innovations at the water energy and agriculture nexus to enhance economic development and resilience to climate change in Kenya, Ethiopia, Sudan and Egypt. Catalyzing cross-border transfer of technologies through benchmarking

ASARECA organized two successive benchmarking exercises on 18 to 22 October 2021 and 4-8 July, 2022, which were hosted by the National Agricultural Research Organization (NARO), Uganda (with 43 participants) and the Tanzania Agricultural Research Institute (TARI) (45 participants) respectively. A total of 88 stakeholder's mainly young scientists, farmer leaders and the private sector actors from all the 14 ASARECA member countries participated. Cassava thrives in Sino-African deal

Inside an agriculture demonstration center in the Republic of the Congo, machines are automatically cleaning, peeling, slicing and grinding cassava, turning the starchy tubers into flour. For a long time, cassava crops in the central African nation have been manually peeled, and soaked in water before being dried and ground, a process that can take a few days. Earlier this year, a cassava flour production line introduced from China was set up at the center in Brazzaville, with the capacity to produce 4,000 tonnes of high-quality flour annually. Making the best of agro-weather advisories

Upon receiving an appropriately packaged climate forecast disseminated in October 2022 for upcoming short rains with poor distribution, Mary Samson Mueni, a smallholder farmer in Kitui County, Kenya decided to grow a dryland crop (sorghum). She specifically sourced an early maturing variety (Kadam) from an agro-vet shop in mid-November 2022. In early February 2023, she harvested 90 kg from less than an acre garden, sold most of the sorghum, and used some of the money to pay school fees for her
